Position Summary:

The Journeyman Lineman Troubleshooter works under the direct supervision of the Line Superintendent, Working Foreman or Lead Lineman. Performs numerous duties including construction, maintenance and repair of overhead and underground distribution and transmission lines and related facilities, plus service work and other related and assigned duties.

Responsible for complying with member requests for service; investigating trouble; taking necessary action; restoring service; making connects and disconnects; installing and removing transformers; running secondary services; preparing staking sheets as required; and making accurate reports of all work performed.

Job Requirements:

- Journeyman Lineman certificate.
- Know and follow all safety rules and procedures.
- Ability to work independently with little direction and with a sense of ownership and personal commitment to a Zero Injury/Occupational Illness culture.
- Class A Commercial Driver's License with appropriate endorsements. (Required before employment)
- Must be able to climb, stoop, kneel, crouch, crawl and meet physical demands of this job.
- Must be able to apply CPR/first aid techniques.
- Required to submit to a random drug and alcohol test per DOT requirements.
- Pass background check.

Special Requirement: Must live within a 20-mile radius or 30 minutes' response time of office of assignment.

Hiring Process: Applicant must upload a resume and Journeyman Lineman Certificate. Applicants who meet the requirements and if selected to move forward to a phone screen interview. The final selection criteria will include an in person interview as well as give consent for background check and Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration query. Dates for interview and testing are to be determined and will be shared with successful candidates.
